## Pastor's Space

Advent – the season of anticipation. As God's children it is okay to become as excited about Christ's birthday celebration as our own children get for their own birthday celebration or their anticipation of opening presents on Christmas. The awe and wonder of God's redemptive miracle should find us humbled, happy, and thankful that this greatest of gifts has provided each of us with eternal hope and assurance of life everlasting in the arms of God, our Creator and Ruler.

One of the best anticipation carols is "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel." Regardless of how much we have experienced Christ's coming into our lives in past years, the next greatest gift is His coming to each of us even more this time around. While we tell the story of Santa with sleigh and reindeer complete with the promise that he will visit each child on Christmas, for Christians worldwide we don't have to worry about reindeer and sleigh for Jesus to give Himself to us; all we have to do is welcome Him into our hearts. For some this will be the first time, but for others it will be the 'again' time - again.

It's a little like our Emmaus experience. The first time seems like such a new, refreshing experience that we are sure we will never have it again; yet, as we return to that Emmaus manger of love again and again, it just keeps bringing new Christlike birth into our lives.

Dr. Dennis Kinlaw and his wife provided one of our Christ's anticipation moments for me. We were attending the United Methodist church for the first time in Wilmore, Kentucky, where I was just beginning my Asbury ministerial studies. The pastor made a point to all the members that they should be sure to seek out the 'newbies' and give us a hearty welcome. This loving, gracious elderly couple turned around and gave me a great, grand welcome. Only later did I realize I was lovingly, warmly and sincerely welcomed by the President of Asbury College and his wife. They remain for me a Christ moment in my life. In his devotional, "This Day With the Master," Dr. Kinlaw quoted Psalm 37:7, "Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for Him," as his lead verse about having "Prepared Hearts" each year for Christ's Advent.

He compares preparation for Christ to the way we should all prepare for communion. In an old Scottish church they established the Wednesday night service before communion as a way to be prepared for the communion that was coming on Sunday. It was not through the hustle and bustle business of holiday spirit events, but rather through the quiet, settling of souls with prayer and meditation preparation that we become fully open to all the Savior of the World would have us receive on His Birth Night. We can practice this "be prepared" exercise each Sunday before worship by spending a quiet time in our Sanctuary – getting our spirit in tune with the Spirit of God. Each of the Sundays then can become our 'anticipation' preparation of Christ's Advent into our hearts. He is Emmanuel – the one who came to dwell with us.

Using O Come, O Come Emmanuel as a foundation for those quiet preparation times will help us keep focused upon some of the gifts Christ brings to us. In verse 1, we find He **Ransoms** us from sin and the exile that this last year has laid upon us. In verse 2, we find the gift of **Wisdom** (law) of all creation. In verse 3, we receive the Lord of Might's **Resurrection** gift from death and the victory over the grave promise. In verse 4, we find Christ is the **Light** that dispels the dark clouds of this earthly life as our Day-spring cheer. And, finally, in verse 5, Christ comes as the **Key** to our heavenly home; God's promise of the most precious of gifts – an eternal relationship with Him.

"Christ came not only to be the Emmanuel – God with us – but even in the more personal way, God in us" (Kenneth Osbeck – *Amazing Grace*) Advent is like spring cleaning where all is scoured and cleaned, and the windows are opened to let the fresh air in. Advent is the opportunity to get our hearts 'prepared' for the time of wide-open reception of the Spirit of God in Jesus Christ, our Lord and Master, our King of Kings, our Prince of Peace, Wonderful Counselor and Almighty God.

And may all your Christmases be Christ-white and bright,

## Walk finance report from the Community Treasurer, Les Reimer

The Heartland Faithful Emmaus Community received a very favorable per person rate for the first two Walks that they held in 2008 at Camp Carol Joy Holling. However, due to rate increases and the fact that the Camp will now charge our Community their normal rates, the projected weekend cost for the Walks in April of 2009 will now be approximately \$200.00 per person. In an effort to keep the weekend costs as reasonable as possible, the current Steering Committee voted in July that the community would subsidize this amount by approximately \$50.00 and set the charge for each person attending the weekend at \$150.00. This projected cost per person is based on the assumption that there will be a minimum of 20 pilgrims attending each Walk weekend, and with all the conference team members needed for each Walk, the total subsidized amount is approximately \$4000.

What does this mean? The Steering Committee, by faith, is trusting that our 4<sup>th</sup> day community will help in covering the \$4000 needed to meet expenses for the next set of walks. However, keep in mind that this \$4000 does not include the funds needed in the general fund to cover the fixed expenses for 2009.

What if you're not staying the entire weekend? If you are not staying the entire weekend but only eating a meal or only staying one night at the retreat center, you will be charged the full price for the meals eaten or nights stayed.

So how do I help? To date, the 4<sup>th</sup> day community has already donated approximately \$1800 at the Gathering offerings of July, August, September, October, and November, and this will be applied towards the \$4000 subsidization. We're not quite halfway there but there are three more Gatherings until the walks in April. Please be in prayer about how God might want you to help.

As Les reported in his article, The Carol Joy Holling Retreat Center has raised their prices and the steering committee has voted to subsidize the total amount by \$50. To help with this shortfall we have looked at selling a Heartland Faithful Walk to Emmaus shirt. I talked about this at the September Community Gathering. After that Gathering I have had a lot of interest in the shirts. I have made an initial design and I am working with a graphic designer I know to finish it up.

## Chairman's Corner

It's almost 2009 and our next set of Walks are quickly approaching. After our first set of Walks, Heartland Faithful was praised by the International Emmaus Board (Nashville) for the way we prepared ourselves for the Walks. Many people within Heartland Faithful still had questions about the behind the scenes "servanthood" requirements. In an attempt to bring ourselves into alignment with the rest of the world-wide Emmaus communities, the Steering Committee was committed to "steer" the new Heartland Faithful community to be "Emmaus-compliant." Over the next few weeks, the Heartland Faithful Emmaus Steering Committee (and after January 1, 2009, the Heartland Faithful Community Board) will be bringing to the community forth communications explaining the various Servant Teams that will support each weekend Walk. Please, do not delete these emails, but prayerfully consider where you would like to support your community through your time, efforts, and prayers. Remember, the purpose for the Walk to Emmaus is to develop Christian leaders and the first step is to serve on a Servant Team. If you've already have served on a weekend, even if you've already served in the capacity of a weekend Lay Director, your experience is invaluable in helping those who are working their way "up the ladder."

### PURPOSE

The 2005 "Coordinator's Manual" states that the purpose of this manual is to provide Emmaus communities with an explanation of each support role necessary for a successful Walk to Emmaus. Because of logistical differences between camps, churches, and retreat centers, as well as local community traditions, this manual cannot speak to all the support needs of any one community. But it outlines the principles of **anonymous servanthood** and lists standard requirements for an Emmaus weekend.

Support roles may be performed by different persons or committees; the more persons involved, the healthier the Emmaus community becomes. The principle to remember and incorporate into your community's ongoing policy is: involve as many different people as possible from every geographic region of your community *for every Walk*. Avoid the temptations to reuse people just because they want to serve or because it's easier than recruiting new people. Keep in mind the dual focus of community health and leadership development.

### DEFINITION

Support servants are volunteers from the Emmaus community who work behind the scenes. They are not selected or elected by the Team Selection Committee or the Walk Lay Director. (Please note that they are called Servant Teams, not Agape Teams as you will see the reason why in future emails.)

Each member of the Emmaus Board of Directors chairs a committee responsible for a portion of the Walk. Each committee finds volunteers from completed volunteer sign-up sheets to carry out that committee's responsibilities for each Emmaus event. (Note: These teams are called Agape, Facilities, Kitchen, Music/Entertainment, Prayer, Registrar, Sponsors' Hour/Candlelight Service, Supply/Literature, and Transportation/Housing Chairs.)

### QUALIFICATIONS OF A SUPPORT SERVANT

Anyone who has attended a Walk to Emmaus, Chrysalis event or another recognized Fourth-Day even (i.e. Via de Christo, Cursillo, Chrysalis, etc.) may work in a support role. Progressive servanthood begins with prayer and service behind the scenes.

## Chairman's Corner Continued

### HOW MUCH SUPPORT IS NECESSARY?

Each community determines the number of volunteers required to effectively and efficiently handle the assigned tasks. Please do not overwork persons who serve behind the scenes because that may make it difficult to find volunteers for future Walks. At the same time, do not enlist more servants than needed. Experience will quickly establish the right number of volunteers needed to get the job done. If you have any doubt, add one servant.

\*\*\*\*\*

The above points are a direct quote from the 2005 Director's Manual. During Walk #1, some of the areas of the Servant Teams were short of the necessary volunteers needed to perform our weekend tasks. Beginning in the new year, the Board will be asking those not selected to serve in the Conference Room to prayerfully consider serving on the various Servant Teams. Some will be asked to serve as Weekend Coordinators (WC) for the various servant teams. When asked to serve in this capacity, please feel blessed, for the WC is an important position and part of the development of Christian Leaders the Walk to Emmaus is designed to promote.

Dr. Richard Gilmore, the former International Lay Director for the Walk To Emmaus, once stated that there is a need for 75 members of an Emmaus Community to properly support a weekend Walk. Recently, there was an Email that identified 26 Group Reunions and over 130 members of the Community actively participating in these Group Reunions. The Heartland Faithful Emmaus Community is a very healthy Community and the spark lit by the Holy Spirit is burning ever so brightly.

Please watch for future communications that outline the responsibility of every Servant Team supporting the Heartland Faithful Emmaus Community Walks #2 & #3 next April. As we bring new Pilgrims to these weekends, let us give our hearts, our time, and our prayers in making this an event blessed by our Father and touched by the gift of the Holy Spirit!

## Working together through Community Training

Can't spend the entire weekend serving at a walk? Maybe you're a sponsor and need to take care of the pilgrims family? Maybe you want to serve but only have a couple of hours to commit? We all have lives outside of Emmaus but want to be involved and support the weekend. Well.....



Sponsors' Hour and Candlelight are the perfect way to show your love, support and encouragement to the pilgrims on their walk just as it was shown on your walk.

**Sponsors' Hour** is held on Thursday evening, right after the Pilgrims and Team members go to the Conference Room. It is a brief prayer service held in the CR Chapel open to Sponsors and all 4th Dayers. There will be a cross for each Pilgrim laying on the altar and a larger cross close by. The name of the Pilgrim is read. The Sponsor comes forward, holds the cross and prays over it. All others pray silently in their seats. The Pilgrim's cross is then hung on the larger cross where it will stay until the Commissioning Service on Sunday. That large cross is taken to the Servant Chapel where the crosses are prayed over all weekend.

**Candlelight** is on Saturday night. The Community gathers at **8:30 pm** for singing, prayer and Communion. All 4th Dayers sign in. A paper with the names of each community represented is given to the Conference Room Spiritual Director. Bring your Candles or borrow one from the box in the Chapel. Start with singing. Then each Pilgrim's name is read and all present pray silently for that person. After all have been prayed for, Communion is served. An offering will be received. The song, "Jesus, Jesus" is practiced to be sung to the Conference Room as they come into the Chapel. When told that the Pilgrims are coming, "light" candles and stand quietly until the door opens. Start singing, "Jesus, Jesus" and continue until the Conference Room is in front of the room facing the 4th Day. The Spiritual Director will say a few words. When he mentions your community, lift your candle high and put it down. Then the Pilgrims will sing "Jesus, Jesus" back. The back row of the 4th Day walks across to the right side of the room, down the outside aisle, in front of the Conference Room and out the door. Then the next row follows until all are out of the Chapel. Return borrowed candles to the box outside the Chapel. Leave quickly and quietly, taking everything with you. Plan to be back Sunday no later than 4:00p.m. for Closing in the Chapel! Bev Allen

## Community Training Continued:



Or..... How about trying Music and Entertainment? You could be a weekend coordinator or volunteer to lead music at non-conference room events. Maybe your talents lie in drama or comedy for the Saturday night skit

Sometimes you just have to sing other times you need a good laugh, when you need to do either you need the Music and Entertainment (M&E) board member. Greetings from the Heartland Faithful steering committee Music and Entertainment chair. I am writing a brief overview of what the M&E chair does and how you can become more involved in supporting Walk to Emmaus.

Like all board positions the first and most important thing the M&E board member does is help strengthen the leadership of God's church. One of the ways this happens is having a sub-committee that helps support the board member do his/her job. If there is something that you feel strongly about talk to the board representative in that area and let them know you would like to help.

There are only two things the M&E board representative has to do for a walk. Select a walk coordinator for each walk and train the coordinators. The walk coordinator then takes responsibility for the walks.

The walk coordinator sets up the music and entertainment for all non-conference room events. This includes sendoff, candlelight and closing. Musicians within the conference room are selected by the team selection team. The other responsibility is the entertainment for Saturday night's dinner. The entertainment should be light and fun creating a festive atmosphere and should be around 15 minutes long.

The goal of the walk coordinator is to get people involved in helping with the walk. Showing willingness to help support the walk will increase your likelihood of being asked into the conference room. Each step in the Walk to Emmaus is designed to help grow you as leader within the Church.

The manual focuses most on the walk responsibilities of the M&E positions. There are day to day operations that are handled as well such as handling the CCLI process and helping obtaining musicians for gatherings and other Emmaus functions.

I hope you have found this information helpful. If you are excited about any aspect of Walk to Emmaus I encourage you to talk to the board and get involved! Peace be with you. Jason Buss
