

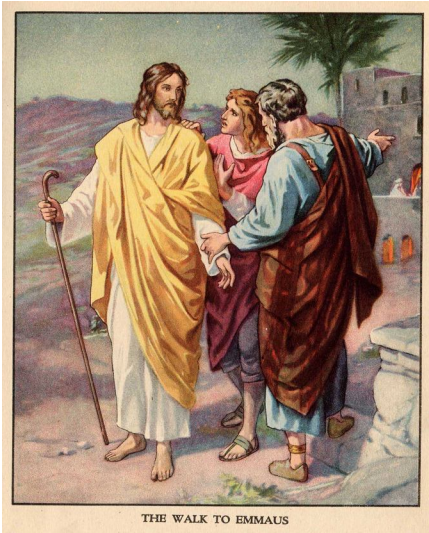

## **Director's Thoughts**

### **Be A Standing Stone**

I have wondered before, why people would have taken the time and effort to stand a large stone on end. What was the reason behind the considerable work to accomplish the task? It seems like many of the photo's I had seen of these large stones on end were in the middle-eastern part of the world. Well, during a small group bible study a few weeks ago the topic of why people would stand stones on end was part of the lesson. It was explained that people did this to attract attention. Sort of like the concept of our current day billboards, but not as unattractive or annoying as those we have today. (Sorry advertisers) We learned that these stones could gain the attention of the curious onlooker, and then it would provide an opportunity for the person that moved the stone to discuss the event or reason why they turned the stone on end. It may give an opportunity to tell someone new about their God and the great event that he had witnessed or miracle that was revealed, and that is why the stone marks the spot. An early form of advertising and outreach utilizing what God had provided – a stone.

I thought; how interesting and marvelous, that God would move people to stand a stone on end as a method to spread His word ---- AND that thousands of years later, it is still working.

I also realized that God is consistent in this message. The concept of the comparison to modern billboards may be just partially correct. Not only do the standing stones themselves still work, but, I believe God is asking each Christian to be that standing stone today. He wants us to be the attraction to that curious onlooker, so we can spread His word.

I think that is one of the main lessons we learn in our Walk to Emmaus weekend experience. The messages from many of the Emmaus talks better prepare us to stand as that stone and attract others. The walk to Emmaus also prepares us on how to ask for God's assistance in spreading His word after the attention has been drawn. Just as no two stones are alike, we each have our individual way to attract others and be used by God to spread His word. When and how He will use each of us as is His will and according to His plan.

It is so amazing to think that thousands of years ago, God moved people to stand some stones on end, He then moved us to go on a weekend Walk to Emmaus just to prepare us to understand this simple and beautiful concept. Go be a standing stone.

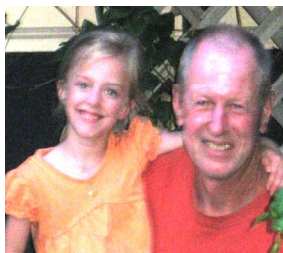

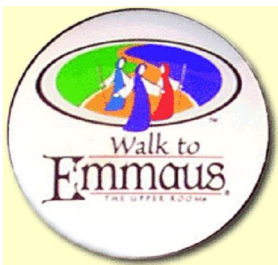
**Yes Lord, Yes Lord, Yes Yes Lord**

**One of the tenets of The Walk to Emmaus is “progressive servanthood.” It is the trained and disciplined support staff that leads to a well-run Walk. It is your service as a committee member that becomes the face, hands, and feet of Christ - the channels of grace - that touch the pilgrims in a physical display of God’s love that they can hardly understand or fully explain when asked to do so. Your participation is then recorded as evidence of your desire to serve in ever-increasing levels of responsibility in following Walks. When serving on a Walk committee your humble and selfless heart will lead to a sense of personal satisfaction. The Handbook quotes Luke 17:10 where Jesus says, “So you also, when you have done all that you were ordered to do, say, ‘We are worthless slaves; we have done only what we ought to have done!’”**

**The purpose of Emmaus is not fully realized during the three days of the walk event itself, but in the Fourth Day. And it is the service that each of you provide as a member of a support team that truly represent the character of Christ and those of the Holy Spirit in what Paul calls the “fruit of the spirit” in Galatians 5:22-26. A developing sense of unconditional love is probably the most frequent comment made by pilgrims when asked later about their experience. True, the conference room team has immediate impact on the pilgrims, but the work of the unseen many does not go unnoticed nor unappreciated. In fact, if you think back to your own walk, did not the sacrifice of those unnamed workers touch your soul and add to level of appreciation of God’s great love for you because of them?**

**So, my brothers and sisters, the time has come to say, “Yes.” “Yes” to the Prayer Committee (vigil and chapel), “yes” to the Kitchen Committee, “yes” to the Agape Food and Table Agape Committees, “yes” to the Facilities Committee, “yes” to the Sponsors’ Hour/Candlelight Committee, and “yes” here are my slightly used, treasured books for distribution. 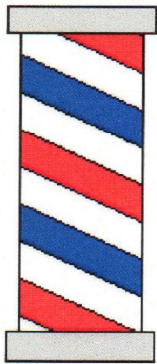
